Spring is finally around the corner! The Dogwood Arts Island Home Trail will be one of three featured South Knoxville Trails this spring along with Lakemoor Hills and Chapman Highway. A few special events will take place in April to celebrate the trails and gardens in South Knoxville.

In addition to our short but lovely trail through Island Home Park, four neighborhood gardens will be Camera Sites. The Stanley and Wrisberg homes on Spence Place and the Archer and Bouchard-Dean homes on Island Home Boulevard will be recognized for their garden beauty. The Stanley home next to Stanley's Greenhouse on Davenport Rd. is listed with our trail, too. A

Camera Site and Open Garden are adjacent to the historic home on the greenhouse property.

Ours is a very popular Dogwood Arts trail with an estimated 5,000 visitors. Let's all try to keep our gardens spruced up during April and remember visitors are admiring our homes and gardens the entire month. Short on blooming trees and shrubs? The addition of pots or beds of colorful annuals can make any home look like spring.

Per the City of Knoxville – brush and leaves should NOT be placed in the median (in our case the Boulevard) or on other public property.

City to Study Speeding

Along Portion of Maplewood Drive and Spence Place

In our Island Home Park neighborhood the combined Maplewood Drive/Spence Place roads comprise the most direct access to Island Home Park, Will Skelton Greenway and Downtown Knoxville Airport. As such, it has for some time been the most heavily traveled thoroughfare in our neighborhood. With the now ever increasing popularity and growth in and around our immediate neighborhood and South Knoxville in general, there has been a consequential increase in vehicular, bicycle and pedestrian traffic that is evident on a daily basis to those residing along the Maplewood Drive segment and Spence Place.

While speeding vehicles have always been a problematic characteristic of this traffic, the growing traffic volume has made the problem even more concerning and more intolerable. Simply stated, it has become a tangible threat to the personal safety of many residents and visitors, young and old, who drive, bike or walk along this roadway.

To address this concern, Board members representing the affected Maplewood and Spence Place neighbors and led by Joni Morabito, have submitted a petition to the City qualifying for a traffic study of the roads for the purpose of determining if appropriate traffic calming measures (speed humps, signage, etc.) are warranted. The study is expected to commence in the near term.
