The intersection where Island Home Ave. meets Sevier Ave. is going through some changes. Previously laundromat, the building at 1130 Sevier Ave. is now home to Alliance Brewing and 3 Bears Coffee. The building is enjoying the benefits of a façade grant and is evidence of further revitalization along Sevier Ave. The former home of Vol 'n Beers at 1317 Island Home Ave. has a newly renovated interior and is now home to Trailhead Beer Market.

Alliance Brewing serves a wide selection of beers that changes periodically. Alliance does not serve food but regularly has food trucks. Alliance is open every week day 5-9, Saturdays 12-9, Sundays 1-7, and closed Mondays.

3 Bears Coffee, located in the same building, serves fair trade coffee. 3 Bears Coffee has been a staple of the farmers market in Market Square for years. The coffee is reasonably priced and it is a convenient place to stop for those heading downtown in the morning.

Trailhead Beer Market features a wide selection of craft beers. The regularly changing local and regional beers allow patrons to try something new every time they visit.
